





## Racism Racism is the belief that people of a particular racial group, typically one that is the minority or marginalized are inferior and the action of prejudice, discrimination, and antagonism to that particular racial group. Ableism Ableism s the belief that people with disabilities are inherently inferior and/or are in need of fixing; rather than the belief that we as a society need to remove barriers and provide accommodations.
